- Chapter-approved monies from contingency reflected in End-of-Year TAM Budget-to-Actual report

- Check Request Vouchers are signed by the Preparer, Chairman/Officer, and Basileus or bonded officer, and TAM
- Proof of payment included with Check Request Vouchers
- PayPal monies transferred to bank account correspond to amounts reflected on PayPal printout

- PayPal transfer written request from PG to TAM
- Voided checks retained
- Mathematical Methods

- All checks are numerically controlled and accounted for in cash disbursement journal

The Internal Audit of Calendar Year 2015 was successfully completed. The following discrepancies were noted:

- ▶ Voided Check 1010: The voided check was maintained but not recorded in the January TAM report.
- October 2015 PNC Bank Statement: The statement was maintained in paper form but was not signed by the Basileus.
- Several vouchers were missing the signature of the committee chairman and/or preparer.

The committee concluded that the discrepancies discovered were minor oversights. To be in compliance with *Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated, Financial Fitness; Rho Kappa Omega Chapter Bylaws*; and *Rho Kappa Omega Chapter Internal Controls* the committee suggests the discrepancies be corrected.

The committee also makes the following suggestions:

- The procedure for reimbursement when a receipt is lost to be defined in the *Rho Kappa Omega Chapter Bylaws*. Currently, if a soror loses a receipt, she submits a letter.
- A verification of the amounts paid via check/DBT to Alpha Kappa Alpha Corporate Office or North Atlantic Region to accompany vouchers.
- When a monetary donation is made to an organization, a copy of the Donation Letter from PKQ to the organization to accompany vouchers.

This would serve to give those members unfamiliar the Strategic planning process and overview of the charge as well, an opportunity to share the Sorority Strategic Planning Documents.
